

ANTOINE LAVOISIER

Antoine Lavoisier was born in Paris, France on August 26, 1743. He is a famous French chemist. He grew up in an aristocratic and rich family. His father was a lawyer and his mother died when he was only five years old. Antoine discovered his love for science while attending college. However, he initially was going to follow in his father's footsteps, earning a law degree.

In 1775, Lavoisier set up a laboratory in Paris where he could run experiments. His lab became a gathering place of scientists. It was in this lab where Lavoisier made many of his important discoveries in chemistry. Lavoisier considered it important to use experiments, precise measurements, and facts in science.

During his experiments, Lavoisier discovered that water was a compound made of hydrogen and oxygen. Prior to his discovery, scientists throughout history had thought that water was an element.

The French Revolution began in 1789. Lavoisier attempted to remain separate from it, but because he had worked as a tax collector for the government, he was branded a traitor. On May 8, 1794 he was executed by guillotine. A year and a half after he was killed, the government said he had been falsely accused
